COUNTRY HOLIDAYS

Next year I'm going to spend my holiday in a rural area (= area in the country). I'm going to visit a remote village (= a village far from other villages, towns and cities), which is situated in a valley. The village is surrounded by beautiful scenery (= there are many beautiful places



around) with **hills** (= small mountains) and mountains. The view there is really **spectacular** (= very beautiful). The good thing about staying in the country is that you **get peace and quiet** (= a place with little noise), but **the pace of life** (= the speed of life) is really slow.

More contexts for the new words:

- I live in an **urban** area . (= I live in the city.)
- I stayed in a small cottage during my last holiday.
 (= I stayed in a small, village house during my last holiday.)



ENGLISH IN USE

Do you know this construction? If you want to talk about your plans and intentions you should use "to be going to". Here are some more examples for you:

She is not (= isn't) going to stay here.
They are going to stay in a small cottage.
Are you going to visit your home next summer?

PHRASAL VERBS CLOSE-UP



1. If you SEE someone OFF, you go somewhere such as a station or airport with someone in order to say goodbye to them.

Anne **saw** Jack **off** at the station. My parents **saw** me **off** at the airport.

THE MOST EXPENSIVE HOTEL IN THE WORLD

The Emirates Palace, located in the United Arab Emirates city of Abu Dhabi, is **considered** to be the most expensive hotel in the world. It took three years to create it, and the work of 20,000 people from 50 countries. Nobody really knows how much it cost to build, but **rumours** speak of around £2 billion. Outside, it has 114 **domes** that are 80 metres high. Inside, many of the **suites** are furnished in gold and marble. In December 2010, it had the world's most expensive Christmas tree, costing over 11 million dollars. The cheapest room costs \$400 per night, and the most expensive - \$11,500 per night.
