READING COMPREHENSION



ON THE PLANE

Let's continue our lessons about air travel. When we **board** (= get on) the plane, we are greeted by **flight attendants** (= stewards and stewardesses) who help us find our seat. Everybody must remember to put their **hand luggage** (= luggage we can take with us on board) in the **overhead locker** (= a special cupboard where we keep our bags during the flight) and **fasten** (= fix together) **their seatbelts** when a plane **takes off** (= leaves the ground). It is very important to be safe on the



plane. If there are some problems during the **flight** (= a trip by plane), the plane can be **delayed** (= late). Before the plane **lands**, we need to fasten our seatbelts again and **put our seat in the upright position** (= a position in which we can only sit). Now we are ready to finish our flight safely.

More contexts for the new words:

- This is **private land**. Keep away! (= This area belongs to a private person)
- We have no time for **delay**! (= We cannot be late)

Let's look again at **PASSIVE VOICE** with a modal verb. We already know that in this case we need a modal verb, "be" and a past participle.

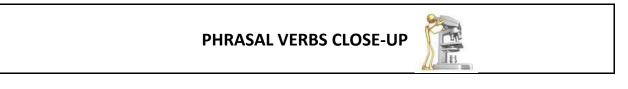
Now look at a sentence from the text and some more examples:

IDIOM CLOSE-UP

A/ Do you like Paulo Coelho's books? B/ No, not really, too many **FLIGHTS OF FANCY**.

A **flight of fancy** (or a **flight of imagination**) is an idea that is unusual and exciting or fun, but silly or not practical.
