

Let me be clear, I'm talking about actual lankiness. Not *Snatch*-era, degs-loving Brad Pitt, who is thin, but could still beat up someone with 150lbs on him. No, I'm talking about the all-angles-and-straight-lines, *limbs*-going-everywhere, might-disappear-if-they-turn-sideways kind of lankiness.

Lankiness calls to mind certain types of **attributes.** To be lanky you must have some slight inclination towards physical coordination. Without the very minimum of consciousness of where you're placing your limbs and why, you'd simply be considered **gangly** — a human, non-green, real-life Gumby. This is not to say that we lanky people have any sort of inherent sense of physical grace."
