# Drug companies to cut down gifts for doctors.

The pharmaceutical industry across the whole European continent now has to follow a tough new code of practice. Drugs companies will have to limit the entertainment they provide to doctors. This follows accusations that companies entertain doctors in order to influence prescribing patterns.

The code tries to respond to such criticism. It puts a strict limit on hospitality and gifts that can be offered to doctors or other drug prescribers.

For example, pharmaceutical companies are no longer allowed to offer personal gifts to healthcare professionals. Any gift offered should be relevant to office use and its value restricted to ten euros. Invitations to sporting or other leisure events are no longer allowed, either.

The code also places tight limits on the widespread practice of companies funding doctors' travel to scientific conferences in order to gain credibility for their products. Drug companies are now allowed to pay only economy air fares for doctors when travel is justified. In addition, payment for spouses is no longer allowed.

There will be sanctions and annual audits to ensure everybody follows the code.

Some countries, including Sweden, the UK, France and Spain, have already brought in tough industry codes of practice. However, a few other EU countries may have to change their culture to meet the demands of the new proposals.

The text contains such a sentence: For example, pharmaceutical companies are <u>no longer</u> allowed to offer healthcare professionals personal gifts. The underlined expression "no longer" means here more or less "już nie" and it is quite a common way of saying this.
